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The Education Planning Continuum™:

Based on the score your child received on the quiz, the following may apply:

High school age students:

- **Score up to 23:**
Ready for ACT/SAT test preparation, college admission essay assistance, and college placement counseling.
- **Score of 24-39:**
Your child may have a learning disability. Educational testing is strongly suggested; your child may benefit from specialized school services and / or specialized school placement; for juniors and seniors - investigate extended time ACT/SAT testing and college placement counseling with possible emphasis on college programs recognizing learning differences.

For those children whose points *primarily* arise from behavioral problems, we encourage you to visit with a local independent educational consultant or contact us as soon as possible regarding school options and possible specialized school placement.

- **Score above 39:**
We strongly suggest that you seek professional assistance immediately! Your child may need a specialty school placement, wilderness program, or therapeutic boarding school placement. As parents we recommend you seek guidance with rules and limits for your teen and monitoring progress. Your child may also need psychoeducational or diagnostic testing.

Students in Grades 1 – 8:

- **Score up to 10:**
Your student is off to a good start; keep up the good work, and set reasonable family rules and goals. If you are worried about a possible learning disability, consult a professional about testing.
- **Score of 11 – 20:**
Educational diagnostic testing is recommended; your answers suggest that your child may be struggling with learning differences.
- **Score over 20:**
Indicates a possible need for psychoeducational and/or diagnostic testing. A special needs school placement may be appropriate, particularly if your student is in 7th or 8th grade. A visit with a qualified professional is highly recommended.
